TOLEDO NORTHWESTERN OHIO FOOD BANK RECEIVES \$4,000 DONATION FROM THE DARDEN FOUNDATION TO HELP END HUNGER

Toledo, Ohio — The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Food Bank announced today a \$4,000 grant from The Darden Foundation to help provide hunger-relief to Northwest Ohio families. The funds will be used towards program infrastructure at the Food Bank’s new North Side Pantry Project in North Toledo. This project will provide direct food services as well as community lab access.

“The North Side Pantry Project is a new initiative to combat hunger in the Toledo area food desert by providing a new source of healthy foods for the residents of North Toledo. With limited options for healthy food access in North Toledo, the health of the neighborhood has suffered significantly, making the need for a service such as the North Side Pantry Project vital for residents of North Toledo.”

The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Food Bank, a member of the Feeding America® network, is one of 193 food banks to receive this funding from The Darden Foundation. It is projected that this grant will enable the Toledo Food Bank to fund several initiatives, including its new North Side Pantry Project in North Toledo.

The Darden Foundation is committed to supporting families facing food insecurity in communities across the United States. Their commitment to help is demonstrated through their partnership with Feeding America and their network of 200 food banks across the nation. In the last three years, Darden has contributed \$12,000 in grant funding to support hunger relief work in Northwest Ohio.

Feeding America has worked alongside The Darden Foundation for seven years in the fight to end hunger. Thanks to their ongoing support, the Feeding America network has been able to help provide even more meals to families in need.

THE TOLEDO NORTHWESTERN OHIO FOODBANK RECEIVES MORGAN STANLEY GRANT TO EXPAND PROGRAM DELIVERING NUTRITIOUS MEALS TO CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Food Bank Participates in Morgan Stanley's Global "Feeding Kids Around the Clock" Initiative

Toledo —August 21, 2019—The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Foodbank on June 4, 2018 announced a \$50,000 grant from the Morgan Stanley Foundation to fund its Backpack Program for the 2018-2019 school year. Employees from Morgan Stanley's Toledo branch volunteered at The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Foodbank as part of Morgan Stanley's "Feeding Kids Around the Clock" initiative, 24-hours of continuous employee volunteer activities around the world dedicated to raising awareness of childhood hunger.

Today The Toledo Northwestern Ohio Foodbank is announcing that they received an additional \$25,000 grant from the Morgan Stanley Foundation to fund its Backpack Program for the 2019-2020 school year.

The Back Pack Program provides nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to children to take home on weekends and school vacations when other resources may not be available.

The Foundation awarded a total of \$1,000,000 in grants to Feeding America® member food banks across the country. Since 2009, the Foundation has partnered with Feeding America, a nationwide network of 200 food banks, and given more than \$23 million to help launch, expand and sustain critical child nutrition programs.
